From the Pastor's Desk

I was probably in seminary before I truly started to pay attention to the church calendar. I was vaguely aware of Lent and Advent as I grew up, but the seasons of the church year didn't impact my life in any real way. The idea that Christ might be so sovereign in my life that I would even keep TIME differently is still relatively new to me. And yet I am so drawn to this rhythm of life that tries to continually connect me to the life of Jesus - and the ongoing unfolding of God's work in my life.

Lent is an especially rich time to engage the church year - not just to remember Jesus' life, death, and resurrection - but to annually re-experience those events. Jesus spent time in the wilderness - we can experience a sense of that action by creating time and space for quiet, simplicity, confession, and prayer. Like the 40 days of Lent, that time in the wilderness can seemingly last a long time - isn't that part of the point? Part of the learning?

As we continue this long journey of Lent, we also anticipate the experiences of Holy Week. I hope you'll each hear the invitation to not just remember that Holy Week happened - but to re-experience the events alongside Jesus - and alongside each other. We gather on **Palm Sunday morning**, calling out, "Hosanna, God Save us!"; on **Maundy Thursday** we obey Jesus' command to serve one another by washing one another's

feet. Jesus also ate and fellowshipped with his disciples and friends and so we experience the warmth of fellowship and love around the tables of **Love Feast** as well. **Good Friday** we must confront the cross - without it there can be no resurrection - **Easter** needs Good Friday. On Sunday morning, like the women disciples, we rise at daybreak to be surprised again by the Resurrecting power of our God. And then we gather once more in celebration to sing our "Hallelujahs!" because Christ has risen! *Christ has risen indeed!*

We are gearing up for the middle district youth volleyball tournament held at Juniata College on Saturday, March 17.



forget that Stone Church pays half of the registration fee for our children and youth. If finances stand in the way of a child going to camp, look for scholarship information in the brochure and consider applying.


