
Though the nations rage from age to age, we remember who holds us fast: God's mercy must deliver us from the conqueror's crushing grasp.

Stone Church Deacon Calling

At this time of year, we reach out to you, the congregation, to call Deacons. Today we ask that you prayerfully consider names of people you think may be a good Deacon. We ask that you write those names below, of those you feel should be "called in" to service. Keep in mind that Stone Church deacons are members of the church, called from this body to be dedicated caregivers, using their spiritual gifts to support our community of faith and pastors.
