Testimony from June Peters



Many of you have heard parts, or all, of my story, but some have heard nothing. For those who've heard it already, bear with me! I'll try to briefly cover the main points.

On January 4, 2015, I had a serious car accident that left me with a broken neck and back, laceration of the head, nerve damage, and many bruises. Following surgeries, hospital stays, and physical therapy at two PT

facilities, I came home early in July and continued PT at home through the end of the year. In 2016, I had some good days, but mostly I had to cope with on-going pain. In 2017, I had four good summer months and was able to attend church and many other activities. Then the pain hit hard again. Since then, I have seen many doctors, and had tests and treatments; but nothing helped.

Early this month, December 5, I hit rock bottom. I lost all hope, had no desire to do anything or see anyone. I lost all purpose for living. I just gave up. I couldn't understand why God was keeping me here to suffer such pain for so long. Over a period of several weeks prior to this, I had two injections that didn't work at the time, two chiropractic treatments and a medication change. The next day, on December 6, I was decorating a small Christmas tree and suddenly realized that I had no pain! Maybe all three of those treatments had helped at that time, but the loss of pain was instant. God found me at the bottom. ...To me, it's my Christmas Miracle! I give God the glory, as well as my family, my friends of Stone Church Community and many other friends, near and far, who have been praying. I'm sometimes stiff, sore, a bit off-balance, and uncomfortable, but I again have hope that I will gain strength and stability. And good results have continued through the time of this writing, December 20!
